### Mark the City's 69th anniversary at the Spring Fling

Cerritos' annual Spring Fling & Fireworks Spectacular on Saturday, April 26 celebrates the City's 69th anniversary. Admission is free to the event, which runs from 4 to 8:30 p.m. at the Cerritos Sports Complex. A dance recital, local talent and professional acts will be featured, along with gourmet food trucks. A fireworks display will be presented at 8:30 p.m.

Cerritos was incorporated on April 24, 1956 as the City of Dairy Valley, reflecting the agricultural focus of the community. The cows outnumbered the City's 3,439 residents by nine to one. The City voted on February 17, 1959 to become a California chartered city and the name change to Cerritos was made official

on January 10, 1967. By 1972, Cerritos was the fastest growing city in California.

In 2008, Cerritos received the nation's oldest and most prestigious award, being named an All-America City by the National Civic League. Today the City is thriving as a home to the Cerritos Auto Square, which generates millions of dollars in sales tax revenue annually; the world-class Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts; and the award-winning Cerritos Library. ### Cerritos General Municipal Election results certified

Three candidates for the Cerritos City Council were selected and two ballot measures were approved by voters in the Cerritos General Municipal Election on Tuesday, March 4. Mark E. Pulido, Jennifer Hong, and Sophia Tse received the highest number of votes and were elected to the Office of Cerritos City Councilmember for a full term of four years. The following measures were adopted:

- Measure J Shall the Cerritos City Charter be amended to require that voter approval must be obtained for any future change to the City's general municipal election date, currently established as the first Tuesday after the first Monday in March of each odd-numbered year, and make conforming amendments to the start date of each City Council member's term and selection date of the Mayor, relating hereto?
- Measure K Shall the Cerritos City Charter be amended to remove or modify provisions based on superseding and preemptive State law, increase City-wide operational efficiency by eliminating references to outdated business practices, and correct grammatical, punctuation, and spelling errors?

Public safety officials from the City and across Los Angeles County joined the Cerritos City Council on February 26 for a dedication ceremony. The Tribute to Public Safety, located in a new gathering space in front of the Cerritos Sheriff's Station/ Community Safety Center, features three bronze sculptures, an honorary memorial, and a monument observing the September 11 terrorist attacks.

The City partnered with artist Gary Alsum and the National Sculptors' Guild for the memorial's design and installation, with inspiration provided by the City's Fine Arts and Historical Commission.

The Tribute to Public Safety memorial features three bronze sculptures; a firefighter performing a rescue, a deputy sheriff, and a sheriff's K-9 unit. An honorary granite memorial pillar recognizes the late Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Detective Donald William Schneider and Detective Sergeant Carl Eugene Wilson, who died serving in Cerritos in 1973. Additionally, a granite monument honors those who lost their lives in the September 11, 2001 attacks, and rests among a newly planted group of trees.

### C-4 Well Site Re-Design and Water Treatment Design contract awarded

The City Council recently awarded a contract to Hazen and Sawyer of Los Angeles for the C-4 Well Site Re-Design and Water Treatment Design.

The project entails the design and construction of a water treatment system to treat constituents from groundwater extracted from the C-4 well site. This project allows the City to continue to provide high-quality drinking water and to meet all federal and state standards.

The City of Cerritos' C-4 water well is one of three active, City-owned water wells in the City. Located at 16807 Studebaker Road, the C-4 water well has been a key source of water for the City's production system since 1977. The C-4 water well supplies approximately 2,500 gallons of potable water per minute.

Renovations to the park's east playground included the removal and replacement of equipment that had been damaged by an arson fire, with funding for the nearly \$255,000 project paid by an insurance settlement.

Visitors of multiple ages can play across two playground structures, one designed for ages 2-5 and another for ages 5-12, atop rubberized surfacing. Additional features include a Tri Runner that allows for seated spinning and a swing structure.

### Metro continues improvements to 605 Freeway

As part of the I-605 Hot Spots Program, the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) is making efforts to ease congestion with improvements to the southbound I-605 Freeway at the South Street off-ramp.

The project adds an additional exit lane from I-605 to the South Street off-ramp. This will result in a standard deceleration distance for motorists exiting the freeway. By reconfiguring the South Street southbound off-ramp, the project will help ease gridlock, enhance mobility and improve public safety and regional traffic flow.

Investing in an alarm and camera system and installing shatter-resistant security film on first-floor windows and doors also help to deter criminals.

### Be cautious of coyotes in Cerritos

Residents are advised to take the following precautions to avoid encounters with coyotes:

- Feed pets indoors.
- Eliminate potential food and water sources, such as fallen fruit or standing water.
- Keep yards free of thick brush and weeds.
- Enclose the bottoms of porches and decks.
- Keep dogs on a leash at all times when outdoors.
- Keep small animals inside or supervised when outdoors. A fenced yard will not protect small animals because coyotes can easily scale residential fences.

Domestic dogs are especially vulnerable to coyote attacks. Adult coyotes are mainly active at night or in the early morning hours, while young coyotes are often active during the day. California covotes have adapted to residential neighborhoods, parks and open spaces in urban and suburban areas. They are especially prevalent in areas bordering a flood channel.

Residents who see a coyote in their neighborhood should try to scare it away by shouting, throwing rocks, blowing portable air horns or acting in other aggressive ways in order to reinforce the coyote's fear of people. Motion-sensitive lights on houses or outbuildings may also deter coyotes from approaching.

If an aggressive or fearless coyote approaches you or your pet, consider the following tips:

- Shout in a deep voice.
- Wave your arms.
- Throw objects at the animal.
- Look the coyote directly in the eyes.
- Stand up if you are seated.
- If you are wearing a coat or vest, spread it open like a cape so that you appear larger.
- Retreat from the situation by walking backward slowly. Do not turn your back on the coyote.

The City of Cerritos contracts with Long Beach Animal Care Services to provide a wide range of services, including coyote management. The City of Long Beach has a comprehensive coyote management plan and that plan serves as the de facto plan for Cerritos by extension of the service contract. The majority of cities in the region all have similar coyote management plans as each plan must be in accord with the regulations established by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife. ### Program fights fraud, notifies homeowners

In an effort to ensure accuracy and protect property owners from real estate fraud, the Los Angeles County Department of Consumer and Business Affairs offers an Enhanced Homeowner Notification Program, which notifies residential property owners throughout Los Angeles County when documents are recorded against their property.

Under the program, owners are alerted within five to 30 business days after certain documents are recorded on their property, including those that pertain to an ownership change, show loans taken against the home, or a Notice of Default or Notice of Sale.

Document copies are sent to homeowners to review for accuracy and legitimacy, giving owners the opportunity to take adequate steps to deal with an impending foreclosure or real estate fraud.

Interested property owners can opt-in for e-notification at dcba.lacounty.gov/portfolio/homeowner-notification-program/. The service emails owners within two days of a document's recording and follows up with a hard copy of the document in the mail.
