The Cerritos Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is offering disaster and emergency training on Friday, November 15, from 5 to 9 p.m.; Saturday, November 16, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; and Sunday, November 17, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Designed to help residents in the event of a disaster or other emergency, the CERT program offers training in disaster preparedness, CERT organization, disaster medical operations, disaster psychology, fire safety and utility controls, light search and rescue, terrorism, and disaster simulation. When emergencies occur,

CERT members are able to provide critical support to first responders, give immediate assistance to victims, and organize volunteers at a disaster site.

Participants are required to wear closed-toed shoes and long pants for safety purposes and attend all three sessions to receive the CERT certification. Those under age 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.
