




CERRITOS RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES

Cerritos Sheriff's Station Residential and Other Types of Burglaries: 15-year Perspective (2009-2023)









CERRITOS RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES BY WEEK / FOUR YEAR PERSPECTIVE 2024




- Numbers correspond to the particular week in a calendar year
- 2024 YTD City-wide weekly average for residential burglaries = 3.8
- 2023 City-wide weekly average for residential burglaries = 2.8
- 2022 City-wide weekly average for residential burglaries = 1.9
- 2021 City-wide weekly average for residential burglaries = 1.2
- 2020 Residential burglaries are lower than the previous two years, most likely due to the Stay at Home order.
- A higher level of residential burglaries generally occurs at the end of the year (holiday season).





Burglars are deterred when the green categories are higher. *Day shift: Sunrise to Sunset. Night shift: Sunset to Sunrise.






